- Tools to improve SWM services are developed and applied
- Improvement measures are agreed upon in a participatory approach and implemented in pilot camps

- Elaboration of an agency wide SWM policy, SWM Operational Strategy for Jordan Field, and SWM Masterplans for selected camps
- Training of UNRWA staff in general in SWM and in application of strategic tools
- Support the cooperation of UNRWA and host municipalities with regard to SWM (e.g. waste transfer and disposal)
- Identify possible cooperation partners for UNRWA and facilitate a dialogue about possible synergies
- Support UNRWA Jordan Field in selecting a pilot camp and implement at least one "quick win" project
